

This presentation discusses the notion of "French Blacks," which obviously does not fit neatly within the classic French Republican understanding of citizenship. How and why is it intellectually and politically legitimate to use this notion? First, Ndiaye will discuss the reasons why French'scholars have been reluctant to focus on racial minorities. Second, he will focus on the notion of "blackness," that is the subjectification of racial identities in France in the 20th century, and showing why a new blackness has emerged in France in the past few years.
