ANNE-EMMANUELLE BERGER is Distinguished Professor of French Literature and Gender Studies at Paris 8 University (Vincennes Saint-Denis). She currently heads the newly founded research unit LEGS (Laboratoire d'études de genre et de sexualité, CNRS/ Université Paris Lumières [Paris 8 / Paris Ouest]). Initially a specialist of 19th-century French poetry, Enlightenment literature and 20th-century French thought, she has been writing mainly for the past ten years on the epistemology and intellectual history of the field of gender and sexuality studies in the Western world, the politics of language(s), and the relations between literature, philosophy and politics.
